ONE-TO-ONE TUTORIALS (GRADES 1-12)

Daily tutorials in reading, writing, math, and study skills

- Individualized, intensive instruction provided by expert teachers
- Reading tutorials targeting decoding, reading comprehension, and reading in the content areas
- Math tutorials focusing on remediating gaps in scope and sequence, from basic math through geometry, and preparing students for advanced classes such as Algebra 2

ELEMENTARY (CURRENT GRADES 1-6)

PLEASE CHOOSE ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

Intensive Reading Instruction (2 Periods)

Students will receive intensive instruction in basic reading skills such as sight word recognition, phonetic strategies, syllabication, and fluency, using proven research based reading programs.

The Reading-Writing Connection (1 Period) & Math Reinforcement (1 Period)

This course is for students who have mastered basic decoding. Students use narrative and expository reading selections as a springboard to improve comprehension and written language skills.

Through stimulating and relevant activities, students will apply math fundamentals to improve higher-order reasoning and problem-solving skills.

PLUS, CHOOSE TWO OF THE FOLLOWING:

Physical Education

This course offers students the opportunity to enhance their gross-motor skills in a safe and positive environment.

Arts and Crafts

Students will experiment with color and perspective and create their own projects.

Science Club

This class features activities based on the core concepts of the science curriculum. Hands-on projects and fun activities will make science come alive.

Computer Camp

Students will develop word processing, desktop publishing, and keyboarding skills.

UPPER SCHOOL (CURRENT GRADES 7-11)

Intensive Reading Instruction (Grades 7-11) 2 Periods

Students will receive intensive instruction in basic reading skills such as sight word recognition, phonetic strategies, syllabication, fluency, and reading in the content areas using proven research based reading programs.

SAT Preparation (Grades 9-11) 2 Periods

This course prepares students for the SAT. The language arts section builds proficiency in vocabulary, reading comprehension, and essay writing. The math section will focus on algebra, geometry, and math reasoning while emphasizing test-taking strategies.

College Essay Writing and Applications (Grades 10-11) 1 Period

Students will get a head start on their personal statements for college essays using specific facts, events, quotations, and examples, and start working on their college applications.

Algebra and Geometry Reinforcement (Current Grades 7-11) 1 Period

This course will focus on preparing students for Algebra 1 and 2 and Geometry by reinforcing and re-teaching critical skills required for success in their upcoming math courses.

Intermediate Math Skills (Grades 7-9) 1 Period

This course gives students a chance to strengthen math skills and to prepare them for upcoming math courses. Students will also focus on applying concepts to solve multi-step word problems and to use formulae. Students will be grouped according to their level of math skills.

Research Papers and Essay Writing (Grades 7-10) 1 Period

Students will use the writing process to develop outlines and write well-organized, thoughtful essays of varying genres. They will learn to gather information from diverse sources, organize and paraphrase ideas, cite sources, and create a comprehensive research paper.

Summer Reading Project (Grades 7-11) 2 Periods

Students will read and analyze a grade appropriate novel, and complete a project.

Athletic Conditioning (Grades 7-11) 2 Periods

Students will strengthen and enhance skills needed for basketball, volleyball, cross-country, general fitness, and agility.

Test-Taking and Study Skills (Grades 7-9) 1 Period

This course teaches students how to learn effectively and how to apply what they have learned. Note-taking, outlining, test-taking, and reading for comprehension will be emphasized.

iPads in the Classroom (Grades 7-11) 1 Period

Students will learn to use the iPad to enhance their learning experiences as they explore the diverse world of educational apps.

Preparing for Driver's Ed (Grades 10-11) 1 Period

Get a head-start on preparing for the written portion of the driver's permit exam. You will review the California Driver Handbook and learn tips on how to become a safe, responsible driver. (Please note that this class is for information only. Students will need to take the certified after-school Driver's Ed course to meet the requirement for obtaining a provisional permit).
