In order to learn more about both typical development and problems in these areas, Dr. Danis returned to the university for advanced training. In 1994, Dr. Danis began a Fellowship in the Developmental Studies Program in the Department of Pediatrics at UCLA. During this fellowship training, emphasis was placed on understanding the processes of normal child development and the important role of the parent-child relationship in that developmental process. Dr. Danis also had significant experience in the diagnosis and treatment of children with a variety of developmental difficulties, including autism, developmental delay, learning problems, and physical challenges. Dr. Danis worked additionally as the Assistant Medical Director of the UCLA Early Intervention Program, a center based program for children ages birth to three years with a variety of developmental difficulties. Dr. Danis is currently engaged in private practice specializing in Developmental and Behavioral Pediatrics. She works with children with a variety of special needs, including children with autism spectrum disorders, attention deficit disorder, and learning challenges.
